

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
PERRY WATER SYSTEM Water Treatment Plant Disinfection Byproducts Monitoring Public Notice

What happened?

Our water system did not meet the requirements of a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During the third quarter monitoring period, in which we were required to test during the second month / second week (August 9-15, 2020), we did not monitor or test for TTHMs and HAA5s in this time frame, and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water at that time.

What should I do?

Some people who drink water containing HAA5s in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

Some people who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous systems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.

Any customers who are concerned about their exposure to DBPs may choose alternative sources of water for ingestion. You do not need to boil your water. However, if you have specific health concerns, please consult your doctor

What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately.

What is being done?

Sampling was completed two weeks past the due date on August 27, 2020. We will continue to monitor during the second month / second week of every three months.
